Dear Crooms Academy Families,

Welcome to Crooms Academy of Information Technology where we are Rich in Tradition, Pride, and Vision! Incredibly, it is time to prepare for the beginning of the 2018-2019 school year. I look forward to welcoming our students back for what we expect will be a successful academic year.

New Technology Fee and Laptop Insurance Payment Method

This year, we are excited to announce you can use MySchoolBucks® to pay Technology Fees and Laptop Insurance in advance of the Orientation Meetings. Using the MySchoolBucks® “School Store” section to pay in advance will streamline the laptop pick up process. In the past, our returning families remember standing in long lines to pay these fees with cash or check the day of laptop pick up. Thanks to MySchoolBucks® this long line is now in the rear view mirror!

Starting July 1, 2018, you may log in to MySchoolBucks® to make your technology payments.

If your student attended school within SCPS last year, you may use the same MySchoolBucks® account used for school lunches.

The fee schedule is as follows:

- Laptop Insurance: \$21
- Technology User Fee: \$31

Laptop Insurance covers replacement of the laptop in the case of loss or irreparable damage with a \$100 deductible rather than the full cost of the laptop at \$1,500. The Technology User Fee assists our academy in covering the cost of replacement parts for laptops as well as the software licensing fees for the programs imaged to our student laptops.

Online Parent Laptop Training for Parents of Returning Students - Accessible Now

The mandatory parent laptop training can be completed online before Laptop Checkout on Wednesday, August 1st. Please use the QR Code below or visit http://bit.ly/croomsaoit_laptoptraining to complete the training. The parent or guardian who completes the laptop training should be the same person who checks out the laptop. A confirmation e-mail is sent once training is completed. Please show a copy of this e-mail at laptop checkout on the 1st. Crooms staff will also have a list of everyone completing the training prior to August 1st for reference. This is not training in use of a computer, but is an orientation to technology use at Crooms. Information includes the Acceptable Use Policy, Discipline Policy, school e-mail, Skyward Parent Access, eCampus, laptop insurance and internet safety.



Laptop Training

August 1st – Schedule Pickup & Laptop Checkout

Here, students will be able to pick up their schedules for 2018-19. Following the meeting, students attend Pre-School Processing in the Cafetorium to register for lunch accounts and order PE and school uniforms.

With confirmation of the online laptop training, signature of the guardians, payment for the technology fees and laptop insurance with MySchoolBucks®, families may check out the laptop. The online training will also be available in Rooms 124 and 126. Laptops are checked out only to parents or guardians. Online payments only*.

Laptop Insurance Fees 2018–2019

Parents are asked to purchase laptop insurance for \$21 to protect against full replacement costs (\$100 deductible) should the laptop become stolen or lost. We also ask parents to provide a \$31 technology user fee to help fund toner, battery chargers and other unfunded technology needs.

Grade 9

Parents

- Check eCampus and Skyward 2-3 times a week.
- Secure a quiet place, free from distractions for your child to study at least one hour per night.
- E-mail is the most effective way to contact your child's teachers. Teachers have 24 hours to respond to your questions or concerns.
- You are in charge of your child's laptop. If you feel they are not using the laptop appropriately, you have the authority to limit or remove the privilege of its use.

Students

- Important information is frequently sent to your Office 365 e-mail account (school e-mail). Please be sure to check this account daily.
- Your GPA (Grade Point Average) begins the first day of school and updates at the end of each semester.
- BEST ADVICE: complete all assignments and submit them on time.
- Take advantage of staying after school to meet with your teacher, available tutoring, and retaking tests whenever possible.
- Attend school daily.
- Do not misuse your laptop in any manner.
- Your parents paid the user and insurance fees for your laptop. They have the authority to determine how much time you spend on your laptop.

Grade 10

- Continue preparing for college this year by focusing on your GPA.
- College admission officers will pay the closest attention to your GPA, class rank, college credit, AP courses and scores on the SAT or ACT.
- Participate in activities that require time and effort outside of school such as volunteer work. The Student Services section of the Crooms AOIT website has the necessary volunteer work forms.

Grade 11

- Take the PSAT for National Merit consideration
- Focus your attention on improving your GPA by spending at least two hours each night on homework.
- Begin searching for colleges through Campus Tours, www.campus-tours.com, online or in person to further narrow your list of colleges to match your personality, GPA, and test scores.
- Take the SAT on school campus which is offered one day per semester. The SAT is free to students. Sign up and register for the ACT and pay to take on a weekend.
- Explore your career options at <https://www.floridashines.org/find-a-career/plan-your-future>.

Grade 12

- Take the SAT on school campus which is offered one day per semester. The SAT is free to students. Sign up and register for the ACT and pay to take on a weekend.
- Compose your college entrance essay.
- Choose 4 or more universities / colleges you are most interested in attending.
- Record the requirements and deadlines of each of your choices.
- Give recommendation forms to the appropriate teachers or counselors and include stamped, college-addressed envelopes. Make sure your portion of the forms are filled out completely and accurately.

Bright Futures Scholarship

The Bright Futures Scholarship Program is the umbrella program for Florida's three state-funded scholarships based on academic achievement of high school student—the Florida Academic Scholars Award, the Florida Merit Scholars Award, and the Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars Award. **The criteria for the three scholarship awards within the Bright Futures Scholarship program has increased.** This information is available at the following website: <http://www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org>. Schedule Changes

Registration for classes is a serious process for all students. Once students sign up for classes, they are committed. Based on Spring registration, some classes are not offered, others expanded, and teachers appointed. Schedule changes are often impossible to make. If a change is absolutely necessary, students may request a schedule change during schedule pick up. Schedule changes are made only for the following reasons:

1. Seniors must add a course required for graduation.
2. Student already has credit for the course.
3. Student does not meet course prerequisites.

Attendance News

Medications

If your student needs to have either prescribed or over-the-counter medication given by school personnel during the school day, state law and school board policy require that you and your physician provide written authorization for administration of both prescription and over-the-counter medication. These required forms can be obtained at the front desk in the lobby.

Bus Transportation

Make sure the address in Skyward is correct so that the SCPS Transportation office uses the most recent address. Bus stops for Crooms are not placed at the same location as stops for in-zone students but are placed to be central to all the students in an area. Students may also experience longer bus rides due to the greater distances involved. Crooms does not create the bus routes nor do we have the authority to make changes in assigned bus stops. To request the change of a school bus stop, you must complete the Transportation Request Form which can be found on the Crooms website and return it to the attendance office. The request will then be reviewed by a member of the SCPS Transportation Routing Department and you will be contacted by them as to its approval.

Shirts: All shirts must be logo items
 Polo Shirts-maroon, black, or tan
 White Oxford-must be worn buttoned up
 Crooms Shirts-only allowed on Fridays with uniform bottoms

Bottoms: Solid colored black or solid colored khaki shorts** and slacks (boys or girls). Solid colored black or solid colored khaki capris or skirts** (girls).

Outerwear: Solid colored black or solid colored maroon Outerwear. Logo shirt must be worn under any winter outerwear.

**Must adhere to SCPS District Policy regarding length - must not be shorter than at least mid-thigh. Rips/tears are not permitted. The waistband of pants, shorts, skirts, or capris must be worn and secured between the hips and the waist. SCPS District Policy adherence is required on all non-uniform days as well as uniform days.

Panther Athletic News

If you are interested in participating in any of Crooms athletic programs, you are highly encouraged to contact the head coach for specific information regarding upcoming activities. Per FHSAA regulations, all fall sports may begin on July 31st and all athletes have a current physical and all required paperwork on file at the school prior to participation. Physical Information

Athletes must have ALL physical forms and certificates updated annually and submitted to the Athletic Department PRIOR to conditioning, tryouts, practices, and games. Only those athletes cleared by the Athletic Department are eligible to participate in activities. Completed paperwork should be turned in 24 hours prior to an athletes anticipated participation date. Only fully completed physical packets will be accepted. Athletic forms can be turned in in room 101A, in the media center, before school or during lunch. Paperwork turned in afterschool will be processed the following day. Students are not cleared until paperwork is processed.
