Advanced Placement Test Performance

2021-2022 Data



Crooms Academy of Information Technology administered 247 Advanced Placement exams in 14 courses (**at no cost** to students). The most popular AP courses are US History, World History, Psychology, Environmental Science, and Statistics.

CAIT had an average **pass rate of 52%** on AP exams. For comparison, the Florida pass rate was 51%, and the national pass rate was 57%.

All juniors and seniors at CAIT get an opportunity to take the SAT **at no cost**.

The average Crooms Academy of Information Technology SAT score is **1128** out of 1600, higher than the Florida average of 983.

CAIT students in 9-11th grade have an opportunity to take the PSAT **at no cost**.

CAIT 10th graders had an average PSAT score of **1028** out of 1520, higher than the Florida average of 890.

College Acceleration and Workforce Readiness

97% of CAIT students take some form of acceleration (college-level classes or industry certifications).

CAIT also offers **5 industry certifications**. Some of the most popular ones are CompTIA IT Fundamentals+ and Microsoft Technology Associate (MTA) - Introduction to Programming Using Java. In total, students earned **307 industry certifications**.
